




### **Alvey Reels News Article**

### January 2016

IT'S a Queensland icon up there with Fourex, Bundaberg Rum and the Ekka. Yet but for fate the famous Alvey fishing reel may never have been created.

When Charles Alvey stepped off the boat from England in 1910, he planned to start a business manufacturing pearl buttons. Unfortunately, his business partner died, leaving him without any funds for the new venture.

After various odd jobs including fixing bicycles, he started making fishing reels with a primitive treadle lathe, betting the Sunshine State would never be short of anglers.

He was right. Almost a century later, the Alvey family is still making fishing reels, albeit with new technology and materials. The Queensland National Trust has listed Alvey as an icon of the state along with the Fourex man and the Ekka. Operating from a small workshop at St Lucia, Charles originally produced about 20 reels a week and would catch the tram into Brisbane to deliver them to the warehouse.

Charles bought his son Ken into the business in the 1920s as custom grew. Ken, a qualified pattern maker and draftsman, helped the business ramp up production and marketing efforts.



### **Alvey Reels News Article**

When Charles dies in 1945 aged 80, his grandson Jack joined the company. Bruce and Glenn Alvey, the great grandsons of Charles, now run the family firm from a factory at Carole Park, shipping the reels around Australia and the world. Some of the original equipment used in Charles Alvey's day is still used in the factory, which employs 26 people.

Bruce Alvey notes that the company is so old that its original advertising slogan 'An Alvey reel fills the creel' is not readily understood today by anglers. A creel is a wicker basket used by anglers to hold fish.

Despite its iconic status, times have become increasingly tough for Alvey. It is facing a variety of headwinds including cheap imports from Asia, rising manufacturing costs, the economic downturn and restrictions on recreational fishing.

"This is probably the toughest time we have ever experienced as we face the rising costs of manufacturing, labour and rates," Alvey says.

Alvey credits the longevity of the family-run company to the quality of its products, with everything from the smallest nut to the largest component still manufactured in house. The design of fishing reels has not changed as much as the materials. The original Alvey reels were made of timber rather than steel or plastic.

But he notes that the obsession with quality may also have come back to haunt the company. Unlike most modern products, Alvey reels tend not to have an inbuilt obsolescence.

"We have probably made our reels too well over the years," Alvey says. "We have people using the same reel that their grandfather used. We really want them to buy a new one."

He says the retail market for fishing equipment is increasingly being dominated by "big box" retailers and this posed challenges for small manufacturers like Alvey.

"We pride ourselves on our products being made in Australia but some in the industry have shifted overseas," he says. "The retailers like the cheaper imports because they can mark them up."



# **Alvey Reels News Article**

The economic downturn also meant people were reluctant to splash out on a top of the range Alvey Reel for \$500.

He says Queensland's \$1 billion recreational fishing industry still played a major role in the local economy, with an estimated 650,000 anglers in the state.

But the industry was facing its own challenges, the chief being government restrictions on where people can legally fish.

"Twenty years ago, you could go fishing where you liked," Mr Alvey said. "Now areas such as marine parks are closed and you can get a massive fine (for fishing in them)."

Alvey says that despite tough times the company remains committed to manufacturing in Queensland.

Resilience in fact has been a byword of the family for generations. During World War II, when materials were not available for fishing reels, the Alveys started making aircraft parts, gun switch boxes and steering boxes for landing barges.

"The family is very proud we have been through some tough times and are still here," he notes. "We just hope the economy will improve in the near future."

# TOURNAMENT DETAILS

#### MEMBERSHIPS

All anglers must be current financial members of a club affiliated with G.F.A.A. or Q.G.F.A and proof of membership may be required. Membership can be organised prior to registration on the night.

#### TOURNAMENT ENTRY

Entry forms must be received by the tournament committee by 6pm Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January. A late fee of \$50 per boat will be incurred for entries after this date. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to any person.

#### BRIEFING

It is compulsory for at least one member of each team to attend the briefing and Calcutta on briefing night.

#### HOME PORTS

Boats may depart from any port to proceed to the fishing grounds to commence fishing at 7.00am on Day 1.

All competing boats must return to the MBBC after cease fishing day 1, and depart from MBBC or Newport on Day 2. Boats may return to home port after cease fishing on day 2. Trailer boats may return to their home boat ramp after each day of fishing but be aware that fishing equipment may be required for inspection at the weigh station.

#### WEATHER AND BREAKDOWNS

No allowance will be made for fishing time lost during bad weather or breakdown. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to cancel or postpone fishing due to bad weather at any time.

#### FISHING GROUNDS

Fishing grounds will be between lines directly east of Point Cartwright to a line directly East of Point Lookout and all oceanic waters in between.

#### PRESENTATION AND LAST MAN STANDING

Each angler must be present at the Presentation and the Last Man Standing draws if he or she is to receive a prize or trophy. The Last Man Standing is a reverse lucky prize draw giveaway for the competing anglers randomly chosen. The order and number of prizes will be determined by the tournament committee and the tournament committee's decision is final.

### RADIO SKEDS

Competing boats must have VHF radio. All skippers must keep radio sked sheets. Skeds will be on VHF21 at 10.03am, 1.03pm and 3.03pm for Day 1, and at 10.03am 12.03pm and 2.03pm for Day 2. Boats are to report name, grid position, strikes, hook ups, tags or captures, anglers name and species to the Game Fish Base. A penalty may apply for failure to respond to skeds. 1st Billfish tagged MUST be called in immediately.

### BOAT LENGTH

For the purpose of the tournament, boat length overall to be determined from the measurement taken from the bow (excluding bowsprit) to the stern (excluding outboard pods). This measurement will be used to determine 7 metres and under, or over 7 metres.

### WEIGH-IN

The weigh-in will be conducted at Moreton Bay Boat Club, Scarborough.

For Day 1 weigh-in will be between 4.30pm and 6.30pm. For Day 2 the weigh-in will be between 3.30pm and 5.30pm. Weigh-in outside these hours by arrangement only (only boats having fished overtime). All edible fish may be gilled and gutted and will attract 10% weight allowance. All record claims must be presented whole.

No points will be recorded unless capture forms are filled in correctly for both tagged and captured fish. To receive points, each angler must present their capture forms, tag cards and captures to the weighmaster in person and must remain with the weighmaster during weighing and recording. There will be a limit of three fish of any one species per angler per day that may be weighed. No fish are to be left at the weigh station. All unwanted fish must be disposed of in the correct manner. Points will be deducted for any infringements.

### BOAT INSURANCE

All boats nominating to fish the Redcliffe Australia Day Billfish Tournament are required to have current boat insurance. Details of such insurance must be completed on the entry form. Should a boat not have insurance or not be able to provide evidence of insurance prior to the commencement of the tournament, that boat shall be excluded from participating in the tournament. All onboard safety remains the responsibility of the owner/ skipper.

### FISHING RULES

- 1. Each team will consist of no more than 6 and no less than two anglers.
- 2. One line class of 8 kg will be fished and points will be scored accordingly.
- 3. A maximum of two rods per angler only at any one time, except when live baiting.
- 4. Live baiting one rod per angler to be used and cannot be handled by others.
- 5. No live bait capture is permitted prior to commencement of fishing on day one.
- 6. Each angler to receive equal fishing opportunity.
- Boat crew is not permitted to assist in any way other than to tag and release or capture the fish as per G.F.A.A rules. Points apply when tag is inserted.
- Hook ups that go into overtime are permitted on day 1 and must be reported to game base prior to cease fishing. No overtime on day 2.
- Tag points will apply to Billfish only. To be eligible for tag points, all Billfish must be tagged with NSW fisheries "Billfish only" tags. Tagging with any other tag will result in disqualification of the fish. Each Billfish tagged will score 750 points.
- 10. The only "other species" eligible for weighing are Yellowfin Tuna, Longtail Tuna, Mahi Mahil Wahoo, Spanish Mackerel and Cobia and the capture must be equal to or greater than line class. A weigh limit of 3 of any one species per angler per day will apply.
- 11. Capture points are calculated as fish weight x 100 divided by line class (8 kg).
- 12. In the event of a tie, the first to attain the total score will be deemed as the winner.
- The tournament committee will decide all trophy winners. The Club reserves the right to review the awarding of any trophy.
- 14. An angler must submit any protests relating to the tournament in writing no later than one hour after the close of the weigh-in on the day of the alleged infringement. Decision of the tournament committee is final.
- 15. Fishing area limits will be as per grid sheet supplied at the briefing. All vessels must log on and off with game fish base. In the event of a vessel returning early, they must notify game fish base.
- 16. Boat skipper or team captain must sign registration form and waiver form as part of their entry to the tournament. All boat owners/skippers MUST have their anglers and crew sign the waiver form attached.
- 17. Boats logging off for the day are deemed to have ceased fishing for that day.
- 18. G.F.A.A Rules and Regulations and Queensland Fisheries restrictions apply.
- 19. Skippers may manoeuvre the boat to assist the angler.

### FUEL AND BERTHS

Fuel and ice will be available (details on briefing night). The MBBC Marina berths will be available to competitors on request.

### AMENITIES

There are amenities available at the club including showers. Ice is available from the club bar.

### MISCONDUCT

The Tournament Committee reserves the right at any stage of the tournament to disqualify or deduct points from individuals or teams who are deemed to have conducted themselves in a disrespectful manner and are deemed to have brought the sport of Gamefishing or the RPG&SC Inc. or the Moreton Bay Boat Club (MBBC) into disrepute. MBBC licensing regulations must be observed including appropriate dress codes and alcohol restrictions and noise limits. MBBC staff must be respected and directions followed. No thongs in the club after 7pm.
