

To win the money for the monthly nominated fish inshore or offshore species, simply weigh in the heaviest **Yellowfin Tuna** or **Dart**. All fish weighed, regardless of whether they are in for the 'fish of the month' must be labelled with the angler's name and line class. To receive double club points, fish must be tagged or caught on the Club Weekend only and the cards correctly completed and handed in or fish weighed in at M.B.B.C. from 3.30pm to 4.30pm on the Sunday. Prizes for the heaviest 'fish of the month' will be awarded at the following club night.

Remember, club fishing weekend starts on midnight on Friday **13th January**, finishing on **Sunday 15th January** with a weigh-in and barbeque at 3.30-4.30pm. A special code for Club Weekend will be issued on the Friday, and this should be displayed with photos of any catch-andrelease fish. This month's species are **Yellowfin Tuna** and **Dart**. The next **Club Meeting** will be held on **Tuesday 10th January at 7.30pm** at the MBBC.





Dear Yvette,

We are delighted to have Bill Byrne back as the DA&F Minister. Please give him your full support as he works to deliver Labor's Sustainable Fishing Policy. According to the most recent Fisheries Qld phone survey we have 405,000 recreational anglers who choose to go fishing in the Moreton Bay Region each year. Many of these anglers supported Labor last election because of their Sustainable Fishing Policy. Fisheries Qld have held talks with both the commercial sector and the recreational sector in addition to other stakeholders to negotiate how to install a net free area in the Moreton Bay Region. They have said that it would cost about \$12-15 Million to buy out the gillnetting in the region. Gillnetting is no longer acceptable in the Moreton Bay Region because of the indiscriminate nature of the apparatus which in addition to fish also catches turtles, dugong, dolphins and even whales. Fisheries were keen not to shut down the profitable fishing methods such as trawling, pot crabbing and tunnel netting (except for sensitive areas) as well as the ocean beach mullet fishery.

Over half of Queensland's recreational fishing takes place in The Moreton Bay Region which occupies just 3% of the Qld coastline. The social and economic benefits resulting from the removal of gillnetting from our region will result in the stimulation of the recreational fishing spend and associated GST receipts. Please support the cost of buying back the gill net licences in the Moreton Bay Region.

On the subject of infrastructure for the 80,000 registered boats in Moreton Bay.

- Our boat launching ramps should be deep enough (some dredging may be required) for all tide
 access and have a floating walkway positioned so the boat and crew can clear the ramp quickly
 allowing for the next boat launching without delay.
- Additional material for Turner Artificial Reef at Scarborough is a great idea which would be welcomed by the MBBC and boat anglers who are not confident to go long distances out into the bay to fish.
- Extra boats for Tangalooma wrecks would be a popular initiative because this is the most used safe anchorage in Moreton Bay Region. Many boaties expressed their disapproval when the rusty superstructure on the old wrecks was cut down by Marine Parks recently for safety reasons.
- A break wall is needed at Bulwer to provide a safe anchorage at the top end of the bay as this
 area is very exposed in a storm. The Bulwer safe anchorage could be named in memory of
 Andrew Thwaites a top fisheries manager who tragically lost his life while scuba diving outside
 Moreton Island earlier this year.

We sincerely appreciate the support you have given us and look forward to continuing to work with you for many years to come.

The Q.G.F.A. sanctioned Tournament aims to promote the sport of Gamefishing and encourage healthy competition between anglers, crews and clubs in a sportsman like manner while enjoying all the social aspects of this event.

This event will be hosted by the Redcliffe Peninsula Game & Sportfish Club Inc. Venue will be the Moreton Bay Boat Club - Bird O'Passage Parade, Scarborough, QLD.

TOURNAMENT DATES & TIMES

THURSDAY 26th of January – Registration 6pm & Briefing 7.00pm SATURDAY 28th of January – Day 1 - Fishing 7am to 4 pm SUNDAY 29th of January – Day 2 - Fishing 7am to 3pm, Dinner & Presentation 6pm

TOURNAMENT DETAILS TOURNAMENT FEES

Tournament entry fee includes 2 meals, quality polo shirt, boat berth*, RED Levy and Last Man Standing Senior Anglers - \$220 per person Junior Anglers - \$140 per person Late Fee \$50.00 per boat

LAST MAN STANDING PRIZES

Last Man Standing (reverse draw) prizes worth thousands of dollars to be won. Prizes will include a boat/motor/trailer package and many other wonderful prizes. Last man standing winners will be drawn each night. Quality prizes and trophies for category winners.

MEMBERSHIPS

All anglers must be current financial members of a club affiliated with G.F.A.A. or Q.G.F.A and proof of membership may be required. Membership can be organised prior to registration on the night.

TOURNAMENT ENTRY

Entry forms received by the tournament committee by 6pm Sunday 15th January will be entered into the early entry CASH prize of \$500.00, to be drawn randomly prior to the start of the Tournament Briefing. A late fee of \$50 per boat will be incurred for entries received after 6pm on the 15 January. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to any person.

BRIEFING

It is compulsory for at least one member of each team to attend the briefing and Calcutta on briefing night.

HOME PORTS

Boats may depart from any port to proceed to the fishing grounds to commence fishing at 7.00am on Day 1.

All competing boats must return to the MBBC after cease fishing day 1, and depart from MBBC or Newport on Day 2. Boats may return to home port after cease fishing on day 2. Trailer boats may return to their home boat ramp after each day of fishing but be aware that fishing equipment may be required for inspection at the weigh station.







TOURNAMENT DETAILS CONT. WEATHER AND BREAKDOWNS

No allowance will be made for fishing time lost during bad weather or breakdown. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to cancel or postpone fishing due to bad weather at any time.

FISHING GROUNDS

Fishing grounds will be between lines directly east of Point Cartwright to a line directly East of Point Lookout and all oceanic waters in between.

PRESENTATION AND LAST MAN STANDING

Each angler must be present at the Presentation and the Last Man Standing draws if he or she is to receive a prize or trophy. The Last Man Standing is a reverse lucky prize draw giveaway for the competing anglers randomly chosen. The order and number of prizes will be determined by the tournament committee and the tournament committee's decision is final.

TROPHY CATEGORIES

CHAMPION ANGLER OVERALL –Perpetual Trophy CHAMPION ANGLER MALE/FEMALE/JUNIOR CHAMPION BOAT AND TEAM – Perpetual Trophy CHAMPION BOAT AND TEAM 7M AND UNDER CHAMPION BOAT AND TEAM OVER 7M CHAMPION ANGLER BILLFISH DAY 1 DAY 2 CHAMPION ANGLER OTHER SPECIES FIRST BILLFISH TAGGED LAST BILLFISH TAGGED

NOMINATED TEAMS EVENT

Tournament organisers will randomly draw teams of 2 boats for the Teams Event on Briefing Night. In the case of an odd number of boats, the last boat drawn will be teamed up with another randomly drawn boat. The team with the highest combined score will be awarded the Champion Two-boat Team.

RADIO SKEDS

Competing boats must have VHF radio. All skippers must keep radio sked sheets. Skeds will be on VHF21 at 10.03am, 1.03pm and 3.03pm for Day 1, and at 10.03am 12.03pm and 2.03pm for Day 2. Boats are to report name, grid position, strikes, hook ups, tags or captures, anglers name and species to the Game Fish Base. A penalty may apply for failure to respond to skeds. 1st Billfish tagged MUST be called in immediately.

BOAT LENGTH

For the purpose of the tournament, boat length overall to be determined from the measurement taken from the bow (excluding bowsprit) to the stern (excluding outboard pods). This measurement will be used to determine 7 metres and under, or over 7 metres.

WEIGH-IN

The weigh-in will be conducted at Moreton Bay Boat Club, Scarborough.

For Day 1 weigh-in will be between 4.30pm and 6.30pm. For Day 2 the weigh-in will be between 3.30pm and 5.30pm. Weigh-in outside these hours by arrangement only (only boats having fished overtime). All edible fish may be gilled and gutted and will attract 10% weight allowance. All record claims must be presented whole.

No points will be recorded unless capture forms are filled in correctly for both tagged and captured fish. To receive points, each angler must present their capture forms, tag cards and captures to the weighmaster in person and must remain with the weighmaster during weighing and recording. There will be a limit of three fish of any one species per angler per day that may be weighed. No fish are to be left at the weigh station. All unwanted fish must be disposed of in the correct manner. Points will be deducted for any infringements.

BOAT INSURANCE

All boats nominating to fish the Redcliffe Australia Day Billfish Tournament are required to have current boat insurance. Details of such insurance must be completed on the entry form. Should a boat not have insurance or not be able to provide evidence of insurance prior to the commencement of the tournament, that boat shall be excluded from participating in the tournament. All onboard safety remains the responsibility of the owner/ skipper.



FISHING RULES

- 1. Each team will consist of no more than 6 and no less than two anglers.
- 2. One line class of 8 kg will be fished and points will be scored accordingly.
- 3. A maximum of two rods per angler only at any one time, except when live baiting.
- 4. Live baiting one rod per angler to be used and cannot be handled by others.
- 5. No live bait capture is permitted prior to commencement of fishing on day one.
- 6. Each angler to receive equal fishing opportunity.
- Boat crew is not permitted to assist in any way other than to tag and release or capture the fish as per G.F.A.A rules. Points apply when tag is inserted.
- Hook ups that go into overtime are permitted on day 1 and must be reported to game base prior to cease fishing. No overtime on day 2.
- Tag points will apply to Billfish only. To be eligible for tag points, all Billfish must be tagged with NSW
 fisheries "Billfish only" tags. Tagging with any other tag will result in disqualification of the fish. Each
 Billfish tagged will score 750 points.
- 10. The only "other species" eligible for weighing are Yellowfin Tuna, Longtail Tuna, Mahi Mahi, Wahoo, Spanish Mackerel and Cobia and the capture must be equal to or greater than line class. A weigh limit of 3 of any one species per angler per day will apply. Note:Queensland Fisheries restrictions may apply
- 11. Capture points are calculated as fish weight x 100 divided by line class (8 kg).
- 12. In the event of a tie, the first to attain the total score will be deemed as the winner.
- The tournament committee will decide all trophy winners. The Club reserves the right to review the awarding of any trophy.
- 14. An angler must submit any protests relating to the tournament in writing no later than one hour after the close of the weigh-in on the day of the alleged infringement. Decision of the tournament committee is final.
- 15. Fishing area limits will be as per the grid sheet supplied at the briefing. All vessels must log on and off with game fish base each day. In the event of a vessel returning early, they must notify game fish base.
- 16. Boat skipper or team captain must sign registration form and waiver form as part of their entry to the tournament. All boat owners/skippers MUST have their anglers and crew sign the waiver form attached.
- 17. Boats logging off for the day are deemed to have ceased fishing for that day.
- 18. G.F.A.A Rules and Regulations and Queensland Fisheries restrictions apply.
- 19. Skippers may manoeuvre the boat to assist the angler.

FUEL AND BERTHS

Fuel and ice will be available (details on briefing night). The MBBC Marina berths will be available to competitors on request, these will be in the form of a berth allocated by the MBBC or in the raft up along the main pontoon

AMENITIES

There are amenities available at the club including showers. Ice is available from the club bar.

MISCONDUCT

The Tournament Committee reserves the right at any stage of the tournament to disqualify or deduct points from individuals or teams who are deemed to have conducted themselves in a disrespectful manner and are deemed to have brought the sport of Gamefishing or the RPG&SC Inc. or the Moreton Bay Boat Club (MBBC) into disrepute. MBBC licensing regulations must be observed including appropriate dress codes and alcohol restrictions and noise limits. MBBC staff must be respected and directions followed.




