


Maddie Eagle and Brad Clayton with a nice black Maddie caught on a 3 marlin day recently aboard Andiamo (see story inside).

Finally we were able to use our Barbeque area for our Sunday afternoon weigh-in and barby. As usual the weather did its best to disrupt the proceedings but only with a light shower. We had a great turnout and plenty of fish to weigh.

Noel Day weighed 2 Tarwhine at 0.49Kg and 0.30kg then a Parrot that went 0.47 kg. Mark Rose weighed what we think was an Iodine Bream that was 1.14 Kg and 6 Diver Whiting for a combined weight of 0.29Kg. Beau Rose presented a Snapper that weighed 0.92Kg and 15 Diver Whiting for a combined weight of 0.66. Billy Jackson weighed in four Diver Whiting at 0.20Kg. Not to be outdone by the young fellas, Graham Rose weighed in 10 Divers for a combined weight of 0.53Kg.

The winning Bream (our fish of the month worth \$100) went to Diego Zambrana, who weighed in two Bream. Unfortunately his heaviest Bream at 0.51Kg was disqualified because Dad had to help him retrieve the rod that was pulled off the pontoon into the canal by the fish. However his other Bream at 0.36Kg was good enough to win the money. A bigger Bream was weighed in by another young guy, Jack Allen (0.60 kg) but unfortunately he isn't a club member yet.

The highlight of the afternoon was a talk by our new Club Captain Ben Kelly on rigging Gar for trolling. Brad Clayton and Dave Morton also assisted, sharing some of their vast knowledge. It was a great opportunity for some of our younger members to learn some new skills and ask questions. We hope to do more of this over the coming months. Thanks guys.

This month (April) our species are Flathead and Pearl Perch. Our numbers might be down a bit, as some members are travelling north over the Easter break. Make sure you come down if you are here and enjoy the food and friendship. Cheers.

To win the money for the monthly nominated fish inshore or offshore species, simply weigh in the heaviest **Flathead** or **Pearl Perch**. All fish weighed, regardless of whether they are in for the 'fish of the month' must be labelled with the angler's name and line class. To receive double club points, fish must be tagged or caught on the Club Weekend only and the cards correctly completed and handed in or fish weighed in at M.B.B.C. from 3.30pm to 4.30pm on the Sunday. Prizes for the heaviest 'fish of the month' will be awarded at the following club night.

Remember, club fishing weekend starts on midnight on Good Friday **14th April**, finishing on **Sunday 16th April** (Easter Sunday) with a weigh-in and barbeque at 3.30-4.30pm. A special code for Club Weekend will be issued on the Friday, and this should be displayed with photos of any catch-and-release fish. This month's species are **Flathead** and **Pearl Perch**. The next **Club Meeting** will be held on **Monday 10th April at 7.30pm** at the MBBC.



Our Tackle Box Editor Robbie asked if I could do another write-up for the Tackle Box after our successful trip on Sunday. I am a bit embarrassed, as I am very shy and not a writer. I need some other people to share their fishing stories too so I am not the only person appearing to dominate the pages of our Tackle Box! Come on ladies and gents start sharing your stories.

Brad decided we might try for a trip out to Luna Park on Sunday 26th March. There was an apparent window of opportunity in the weather, after a week of rain and some solid wind, particularly out wide. It would also be our last chance for a while as quite a few of us are heading North at Easter.

Sunday dawned fine and calm. Andiamo cruised across the bay at 22 knots on a very calm sea. Skipper Brad Clayton, Dave Morton, John and Maddie Eagle and I commented on the beautiful conditions as the sun popped up over Moreton.

We headed straight for the Luna Park area to the North East. Once the gear was set we settled into a nice troll. Brad decided on a mix of lures and a trolled gar. About 45 minutes later Maddie's rod did a little jump then nothing. A minute later a rod with Dave's coloured band on bucked and the reel screamed. Dave was on the rod quickly, but there wasn't much weight or fight in the fish. He quickly brought a small Stripped Tuna onto the boat.

About an hour later we had again commented on the excellent conditions. Noel Day called us over to where he had seen some good bait balls. We headed his way and found scattered bait. Not long after, a reel screamed. It was John's turn. As we pulled the other gear in a nice Black Marlin jumped out wide and went crazy as it peeled line from the reel. John is so cool on a fish. He calmly played it and not long after a nice Black was tagged. We measured it at 1.6M short length for a weight of just above 30kgs. After about another hour I made the comment that maybe the morning bite had finished. Then we had another hit - nothing there. Shortly after we had another hit. Again it was John on strike. This fish hit a gar and dropped it, so John expertly fed back line, and sure enough the fish came back. He was onto a very determined Black that headed in the opposite direction. This fish tried every trick in the book. He was spectacular when he came in close to the boat for the first time. He cartwheeled, jumped, headed straight at us, and then went deep. John was up to it though. After about three more attempts to get him close he finally came in close enough for Brad to pin him. The fight took about 35 minutes. Just as Brad grabbed the leader the main line snapped and the fish swam off. Bit of a win, win really. We use Moi Moi green 8Kg test line and have found that it is breaking well before 8Kg. We estimated that the fish was about the same size as the first one.



We set the gear out again. It was getting close to lunchtime, it was sunny, hot and the sea almost glassed out. Not long after, another strike, this time it was Maddie's turn. The gear came in quickly and her fish was jumping out wide. She let out a couple of excited screams as she settled into the fight. Luckily John was there to calm her down a bit. This fish proved very stubborn also. When it came near the boat it headed for the bottom. Maddie fought it back gallantly, with a few expletives thrown in to scare the fish. Eventually (about 40 minutes) we had a tag in a similar sized Black Marlin. We bought it on board to remove the hooks and noticed another tag in it. The tag looked as if it had been in for a little while, as it had healed well and the tag was stiff and a bit faded. It will be interesting to find out its history. I know the numbers of our tags, so I suspect it could be from a Sunny Coast/ Mooloolaba boat. No wonder the fish didn't want to come near the boat!

After another troll, we decided to give it away and try for some table fish. We were happy with 5-4-4 on the troll. We pulled up a few Pearlies, but a lot of undersized ones. We also caught a couple of Parrot and a nice Trag Jew. It was another great day and a great trip home at around 24 knots across a very flat Moreton Bay. We had ear to ear grins as we cruised up the canals with the flags hoisted.

Thanks guys and the Weather and Fish Gods.
