Hi Fishos,

Champion Club status, we are still in 4th position with 46 species. Next event on the ANSA calendar is the Statewide Species Challenge to be held on the Mayday Long weekend. There is no need to register for this event. The aim of this competition is to catch as may different species of fish over the weekend. It doesn't matter if you tag or bag your fish. The fish can be of any size, but you will need to take a picture and measure and submit capture on the ANSA website.

After that, later in May, Sunshine Coast SFC will be hosting the STH QLD Interclub Challenge May 19th to 21st . This event will be run out of Carlo Point. Venue will be BIG4 Breeze Holiday Park. Challenge is a club-based event, and our club is the defending champions. There are inshore, offshore and land-based fishing on offer. Visit the events page to register. You need to book you own accommodation and mention you are with ANSA Interclub.

The Maryborough Fishing Festival will be based at the Wallace Caravan Park, Ferry St Maryborough. Date from September 29th to October 1st. I usually get there earlier in the week to sample the fishing options. Barra and King Salmon can be caught within 500 metres of the park. Book your accommodation early.

Fishing report – Recently headed up to Villeneuve at the top of Somerset dam to tag Saratoga and end up with 2 from 4 hook ups on bait which is pretty good. A 47cm and a 43cm but dropped the biggest which would have been about 70cm. I need to put more time in there.

Sam King and I finished in 4th place in Tagatoga. Over the 4 fishing sessions we caught one Yellowbelly at 45cm, 13 Bass to 38cm and 11 Toga to 76cm. Most of the Toga were caught on baits under a float but 2 were caught of lures. Best lures, a white Jackall TN60 and a ¼ TT Vortex spinnerbait in baby Bass colour.

Altogether, there was 113 Toga caught with the biggest going 79cm.

Note: Monduran Dam is still firing for Barra and more of the bigger models are starting to bite. This hot fishing should continue.



In 1991 Brian moved up to Scarborough from Melbourne for work with Alcan. He joined the Moreton Bay Boat Club and the Fishing Section that same year.

Brian worked tirelessly for the club, serving on many committees and sub committees, and was instrumental in making our Australia Day Billfish Tournament the success that it is today on the OGFA calendar.

Promotion of Women and Juniors in fishing was of particular interest for Brian, as was his passion for ANSA where he became addicted to the sport in the early 80's.

He also promoted the Fishing Section/Fishing Club within the Moreton Bay Boat Club, gaining respect and credibility from both the Board and the staff which continues to this day.

Brian also served as chairman for 6 years over 2 terms.

In 2006 Brian was bestowed the honour of Life Membership for his dedication and hard work.

Many club members will have lasting memories of Brian's friendship, willingness to help and teach people fishing techniques – especially newcomers to the sport – and his great company when out fishing in either his boat or theirs. Those of us that serve and have served on committee will be forever grateful for his wise counsel and guidance, especially in the tough times, and his knowledge of the history of the club.- RIP Brian
