Club Captain's Report

Been a bit of an interesting month this month, with the whisper of catch's numbering 4-8 solid yellowfin per boat on topwater out wide in august. I started last month trying to get a day off work and recruit a mid-week crew, plus borrow a set of heavy tackle gear to get out amongst it.

But unfortunately, it wasn't meant to be and as quickly as the tuna fever hit the reports of boats doing the miles and donuting started coming in. For now, it seems like the bite is off but could change any day so have you gear ready to rock and roll and be prepared to put the miles in when the weather comes good.

On the bright side the snapper and pearly close is over and by all reports there firing, I'm lucky enough to have one of the SEQ best charter captains "Smithy" as a good mate so straight away I knew the fish were on and if you could get a good weather window you be in with a shot to catch a good bag.

Smithy had been reporting some good days on the snapper bagging his charter out a few times. Having to switch over to other species such as kingfish amber jack & Dollie's which seem also to be on fire on Livies and jigs, when you get out wider and fish the wrecks, reefs or fads

However, these days the wife cracks it if I go on a charter with my boat sitting next to the house collecting dust, so I thought I better dust it off and have a crack myself.

Luckily, I roped in Matty kroll, Ryley kroll & my good mate George from Sunshine Coast club or as I have nick named him "El Presidenta" as he has been Newley awarded skipper of their club.

Anyway, the game plan was pretty simple head off Mooloolaba get a full tank of Livies and hit a number of wrecks ranging from 50m-100m.

The day started off going to plan with full strings of bait coming aboard straight away however quickly had a spanner thrown in the works, when my bait pump blew a fuse on arrival of the first wreck, quick thinking and the washdown house/pump got us out of trouble. However, to our surprise the live baits didn't seem to produce as much as normal, Ryley did manage to catch a good-sized cobia.

But most fish were caught on soft plastics steadily throughout the day, something new for me but seeming to become pretty deadly landing a few snapper and pearlys on the drop out on the wider wrecks.

September Report

Although the Festival officially starts on the Friday, many of us will be arriving earlier in the week just because we can. I always suggest a couple of days pre-fishing and drinking.

At the AGM there will be positions up for grab if you are looking to get involved in the state executive committee. Bob Dover who looks after tagging and Matt Leavy who does promotions are stepping back for now at this stage.

If you have tagged any fish, please make the effort, and submit the tagging information, otherwise you have put a hole in the fish for no reason. It is also disappointing for someone to catch a tagged fish only to find out there are no details. I have experienced this several times.

Just a reminder that QLD Sportfishers have introduced a Landbased division to the All-Tackle Length Only records. The guidelines can be found on the website.

Fishing reports – There are still plenty of Flathead around the usual spots like the Pine River and Ningi Creek. It has been a very consistent season for them.

From some reports I have seen, Somerset Dam is worth a fish again. The dam has been recovering from the floods. The dam has suffered from dirty water, low oxygen levels resulting in a widespread fish kill. I haven't fished it myself for some time, but I am sure it will continue to improve as the water warms up if we don't get another flood.

Hopefully more fishing stories next month.

Friday 27th Competition Briefing

Meet and greet at Moreton Bay Boat Club on the back deck, starting at 6pm. Nibbles will be provided. The restaurant and bar will be open. We will have a short briefing and handout rules and capture sheets. (If you are not attending the briefing, competition organisers can email Briefing handouts out with the Tournament Code).

Saturday 28th Start Fishing

Lines in from 5am. There is no requirement to return to MBBC for Saturday night, but some anglers may choose to meet there for dinner (table reservation recommended). There is no obligation to fish right through. Fish your own hours.

Sunday 29th Cease Fishing and Presentation

Lines out from 2pm. The weigh station will be open for weighing fish and handing in capture sheets from 2.30pm until 3.30pm on Sunday. BBQ and Presentation from 3.30 pm on Sunday on the Grassed area at MBBC. In the event of rain, we will be on the back deck.

Anglers may compete in one or both Challenges over the competition. Maximum of 2 fish of each species may be submitted for each Challenge.

BAY CHALLENGE (bay, lakes, land-based, beaches & rivers) – Fish must be caught from any of the Bay, estuary's, beaches, jetties, canal, lakes or rivers. A combined total length of best 5 fish.

BLUEWATER CHALLENGE (offshore) – Fish must be caught offshore as per the fishing areas and outside a line from Combyora Point on Moreton Is. to Skirmish Point on Bribie Is. A combined total length of best 5 fish.

There will be awards and prizes for: The Longest fish overall in each section. Champion Mens, Ladies, Boys and Girls sections. Mystery Length Fish · Lucky Entry draw.



Entry Fee: \$25.00 for all Senior and any accompanying Juniors are free.

If you are not a member of RPGSC.inc or ANSA, you will need to pay \$15.00 for a temporary membership fee. This applies to seniors and juniors.

GENERAL RULES AND INFORMATION

This is a length-based competition. All fishing is to be conducted under ANSA rules. All State fishing rules and bag limits to be observed. Undersize fish cannot be submitted. You may fish any division. Any fish that will be submitted for the challenges must be photographed twice, once on a brag mat or measuring device with the Tournament Code displayed and once with the angler. The fish must then be documented on the supplied capture sheet to be submitted to the weigh master after cease fishing. While catch and release is encouraged, anglers are also encouraged to keep fish for a feed, and these fish may be presented gilled and gutted. Certified scales will be provided at the weigh in.

Fishing areas are all waters between Noosa Heads to the north and south to QLD/NSW Border including dams and rivers, excluding privately owned waters. Award winners must be present to receive any awarded prize. In the event of a draw in any category, the first angler to accumulate their score will be considered the winner. All species in the ANSA Qld Species list are eligible to submit, excluding Sharks, Rays and Eels.

There will be a free BBQ provided on Sunday for the weigh-in and presentation. Alcoholic beverages may be purchased from the MBBC can bar provided.
