RECORDER REPORT

Hi members,

I recently ask QGFA Recorders Officer, Ian Meads some questions regarding shark tagging in Qld and Nationally, and how tag points for sharks are recorded and recognised.

Reply from Ian below-

"QGFA award 0 points for a shark tag, we do collect the tag data when they are entered in gamebase (as we do with all of the tags), however, they do not add to any point score for any end of year QGFA trophies.

Juniors can submit shark tag cards in the GFAA junior tournament, and they count toward their GFAA junior tournament results.

All tag cards come through me and then after I process them, I post them to NSW Fisheries. NSW Fisheries do all the tag collection and point score for GFAA trophies. GFAA do award points for shark tags and GFAA have all of their trophies listed in the GFAA journal, so shark tags would count toward the club & boat highest tag point score and there is a trophy for tag & release of most sharks in Australian water.

Here (above)is the count of shark tags for QGFA over the last few years since I have been in the recorder role. What I have found is the majority of sharks are tagged as by catch (of which the majority of them have come off my boat – ANARCHY), however, those that do target sharks (esp from Redcliffe PGSC) typically target them as land based on heavy tackle and under QGFA tag point ruling if the shark tag was worth points it would be disqualified from QGFA points score for tagging a fish on heavy tackle in under 80m of water, however, the shark tag cards still count toward GFAA point score regardless of line class and water depth.

The QGFA point score system is explained in the QGFA handbook (attached – there should be a newer version released this year, but the point score hasn't changed) – the QGFA annual point score is the same score system as used for the all ports competition.

So, we do definitely tag sharks in QLD and although they don't count toward QGFA point score we still capture the data from the entries in gamebase. The shark tags do count toward GFAA trophies, however, looking at the past GFAA results I am pretty sure some boats in NSW, VIC & WA definitely target sharks a lot harder than any of the boats in Qld.

I hope that answers some questions, but please let me know if you have any more questions I can help with. Cheers Ian."

I would add, tagging sharks is not that big in QLD but down south it is very popular and to win the GFAA Grahame Williams Trophy is a huge honour. You would probably need to tag and release over 50 sharks to be in the running.





Editors Note –

Sunfish activities.

The last 3 months has been quiet but issues are now emerging after the Xmas break. One matter raised by members is the regulation change to allow "ring netting" for spotty mackerel. This change was done without our knowledge several years ago & we will be following up what Fisheries public consultation actually occurred & whether "due process" was followed. Congratulations to the previous Sunfish Moreton Branch who negotiated a disabled platform to be constructed by the Council at Redcliffe. It is in the pipeline & will be actioned after the election results.

We are still pursuing the establishment of the FQ Moreton Bay working group. Some groups have been finalized & we await the discussions when they first meet.

FQ Grants;-

FQ Grant applications opened on the 1st December & there have been several applications from sunfish members for Kids Fishing Days. These activities & the Instructors are covered by Sunfish Qld insurances.

Fisheries Updates.

At the first meeting of the Trawl WG the stock assessments showed increased prawn abundance in some areas. The big question was – what happens when stocks increase above the 60% target for any fishery. Does the total allowable catch (TAC) increase? – still in the TOO HARD basket.

he allocation of over \$160 million to primarily buy back netting licenses in the GBRMPA area is ow well underway. N1,N2 & N4 netting has ceased with a phase out of other nets & licenses ver the next few years. Two new symbols have been created – NX within the GBR area & N15

south of it – they replace existing netting symbols. The "Structural Adjustment Scheme" covers the commercial fishers & associated businesses. Both the Great Sandy MP & the Gulf of Carpentaria areas are included. Details of the scheme can be found on the FQ web site under "future fishing". We are still concerned about the transfer of effort to other areas & other fisheries such as mud crabs where there is currently unused quota. We will be discussing the finer details later this month with Fisheries.

Marine Parks & Area closures.

The final decision on the Great Sandy MP proposals mainly affects commercial fishing with additional closed areas & depending on submissions will come into effect around mid 2024. It has been complicated with some of the area eligible as part of the GBR structural adjustment. There is a petition before Parliament to have the Mary River & surrounds to high tide declared a net free zone. Anglers are encouraged to go on line at the parliamentary web site & sign the petition.

We are now anticipating the opening of community consultation on Moreton Bay which is expected to occur after the GSMP is finalised.

Research Projects affecting Recreational fishing -

The National recreational fishing survey has been completed & on the FRDC web site. Our Scientific Officer Dr Barry Pollock is continuing to work on several "Citizen Science" projects which are in varying stages of finalization. The publication on the "saddleback" occurrences worldwide & especially in the SE Qld area has raised further interest & may be expanded. Barry's publication on snapper fishing is a book worth reading & is on the Sunfish Web site.

The FQ research paper on Pearl Perch is now finalized & can be accessed through the FRDC web site – the results seem to be lacking some detail & we are investigating how this can be rectified.

You may soon see signs at boat ramps regarding the responsible disposal of fish waste in shark prone areas. Please note what they say.
